What should I do if I see someone else being bullied?

- Don't walk away and ignore the bullying
- Ask the person to stop if it is safe to do so
- Don't stay silent or the bullying will keep happening.

Who can I tell?

- Any adult at our school
- Your class teacher
- Teaching assistant
- A friend

What is bullying?


Bullying can be.....

Physical: when someone hits, pinches or pokes you repeatedly; or shows harmful behaviour that is threatening or intimidating towards you.

Verbal and non-verbal: when someone calls you names, says hurtful comments to you, or gives you

nasty gestures or looks.

Indirect: when you are deliberately excluded from a conversation or a game.





Cyber: when someone sends you unwelcome messages via email, mobile phones or on social media.

If you are being bullied you need to:

- Ask them to STOP it
- Ignore them
- Walk away
- Tell a friend
- Write a note in your class's Worry Sack
- Tell your class teacher
- Tell an adult you trust

Don't:

- Do what they say
- Give in to any pressure
- Fight back
- Think it's your fault
- Hide it
