## Key Stage 2: Years 3 and 4

## Reading: Years 3 and 4

### Our children are taught to read words accurately by:

- Applying a growing knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes
- Reading further exception words, noting the spellings

### Our children are taught to understand texts by:

- Drawing inferences from reading
- Predicting from details stated and implied
- Recalling and summarising main ideas
- Discussing words and phrases that capture the imagination
- Retrieving and recording information from non-fiction, using titles, headings, sub-headings and indexes
- Preparing poems and plays to read aloud with expression, volume, tone and intonation
- Identifying recurring themes and elements of different stories (e.g. good triumphing over evil)
- Recognising some different forms of poetry
- Explaining and discussing understanding of reading, maintaining focus on the topic
- Drawing inferences and justifying inferences with evidence
- Predicting what might happen from details stated and implied
- Identifying main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph and summarise these
- Identifying how language, structure and presentation contribute to meaning
- Asking questions to improve understanding of a text

## Writing: Year 3 and 4

#### When composing their own writing our children are taught:

- To write with purpose
- To use imaginative description
- To organise writing appropriately
- To use paragraphs
- To use sentences appropriately

#### When writing (transcription) our children are taught:

- To present neatly
- To spell correctly
- To punctuate accurately

## When analysing and presentation information our children are taught:

• To use and understand grammatical terminology when discussing writing and reading:

<u>Year 3:</u> word family, conjunction, adverb, proposition, direct speech, inverted commas (or speech marks), prefix, consonant, vowel, clause, subordinate clause.

Year 4: pronoun, possessive pronoun, adverbial.
